

TEACHER-TO-TEACHER

The article "Alfred Hitchcock's America" is not only an excellent introduction to the career of one of the greatest and most acclaimed film directors of all time, it provides a springboard for discussion about the role of movies in American culture, especially in post WW2 American society. Exploring the cultural and economic impact of the film industry is another way to connect eras and help students make meaning of their own lives and the world around them. Analyzing transcripts of a lecture by and an interview with Alfred Hitchcock enable students to gain insight into the artist's own perception of self and his work.
